Claude MeischMinister of Education, Children and Youth
Minister for Higher Education and Research

After obtaining his final school diploma from the Lycée technique Mathias Adam, Claude Meisch enrolled at the University of Trier, from which he graduated in mathematics and economics in 1998.

Following the legislative elections of 20 October 2013, Claude Meisch joined the government as Minister of Education, Children and Youth and as Minister for Higher Education and Research on 4 December 2013 in the coalition government formed by the Democratic Party (DP), the Luxembourg Socialist Workers' Party (LSAP) and the Green Party (déi gréng). After the legislative elections of 14 October 2018, he was reappointed as minister. A member of the DP since 1994, Claude Meisch was elected to Parliament for the first time in 1999. He was re-elected in 2004, 2009 and 2013. At local level, Claude Meisch initially served as a municipal alderman in Differdange from 2000 to 2002, then as mayor from 2002 to 2013.



Franz FayotMinister of the Economy
Minister for Development Cooperation and Humanitarian Affairs

Following secondary school studies at the Athénée de Luxembourg, Franz Fayot pursued a higher education in Luxembourg and Paris, followed by a DEA (post-graduate diploma of advanced studies) in corporate law from the Université Paris I Panthéon-Sorbonne in 1996. Following the cabinet reshuffle on 4 February 2020, Franz Fayot joined the coalition government formed by the Democratic Party (DP), the Luxembourg Socialist Workers' Party (LSAP) and the Green Party (déi gréng). He was appointed Minister for Development Cooperation and Humanitarian Affairs and Minister of the Economy.

A member of the LSAP since 1994, Franz Fayot was elected to Parliament in 2013 and in 2018; he became chairman of the LSAP in 2019. From 1997 until his appointment to the government, Franz Fayot worked as a barrister in Luxembourg.





Joëlle Welfring

Minister for the Environment, Climate and Sustainable Development

After finishing her secondary education at the Lycée Hubert Clément, Joëlle Welfring completed her studies at the Université Louis Pasteur in Strasbourg, where she received a master's degree in biochemistry in 1997. In 1998, she obtained a master's degree in environmental sciences at Brunel University in London.

On 2 May 2022, following the resignation of Carole Dieschbourg, Joëlle Welfring joined the coalition government formed by the Democratic Party (DP), the Luxembourg Socialist Workers' Party (LSAP) and the Green Party (déi gréng) as Minister for the Environment, Climate and Sustainable Development.

Previously from 2010 to 2014, Joëlle Welfring served as director of the Business Development department at the Henri Tudor Public Research Centre, after having directed the Resource Centre for Environmental Technologies (CRTE). On 1 April 2022, Joëlle Welfring was appointed as director of the Environment Agency, where she had been serving as deputy director since 2014.



Christophe Hansen Member of the European Parliament

Since September 2018, Christophe Hansen, who serves as a member of the CSV in the EPP group, has represented the interests of Luxembourg and European citizens in the European Parliament, particularly in the areas of international trade, the environment and the economy. He was re-elected as an MEP in 2019 and elected Quaestor by his peers in 2022. As coordinator for the largest group in the European Parliament on the International Trade Committee, Christophe Hansen is heavily involved in negotiations for EU free trade agreements, including the trade agreements between the EU and Mexico, Chili, Australia, New Zealand and Mercosur. He was Parliament's lead negotiator for the ratification of the Trade & Cooperation Agreement with the UK. Representing the EP, he successfully negotiated and delivered significant legislative proposals, such as the "drinking water" directive as well as the ground-breaking regulation on foreign subsidies and the anti-deforestation regulation.

After obtaining a master's degree in geosciences, environmental sciences and risk management, Christophe Hansen embarked on a European career as policy advisor to a Member of the European Parliament, followed by stints at the Permanent Representation of Luxembourg and at the Brussels branch of the Luxembourg Chamber of Commerce.



Anne Calteux

Head of Representation of EU Commission to Luxembourg

Anne Calteux has been the European Commission's Representative in Luxembourg since September 2021. After her position as Head of European and International Affairs and Senior Advisor to the Minister of Health in Luxembourg, she now manages political communication and strategic coordination for the European Commission in Luxembourg. A European at heart, Anne Calteux has held a number of senior positions where she has exercised a high level of responsibility, notably in the COVID-19 crisis unit at the Ministry of Health. She holds a Master's degree in comparative European law from LLM King's College London, and was a member of the Luxembourg Bar from 1999-2003. Between 2004 and 2013, she covered health and social security files for Luxembourg at the Council of the EU in Brussels.





Prof. Jens Kreisel Rector, University of Luxembourg

Prof. Jens Kreisel took office as Rector of the University of Luxembourg on 1 January 2023.

Jens Kreisel studied physics and materials sciences in Karlsruhe (D), Lyon (F) and Grenoble (F) and obtained in 1999 his PhD in materials physics at the Grenoble Institute of Technology (Grenoble INP). After a post-doc at the University of Oxford, he continued his international career in Grenoble where he was until 2011 Director of Research at CNRS, the French National Centre for Scientific Research. From 2006 to 2011, he also acted as advisor to the President and then as Deputy Vice-President for International Relations in the senior management team of Grenoble INP.

In 2012, Jens Kreisel joined Luxembourg and became the Founding Director of the Materials Research and Technology department at the Luxembourg Institute of Science and Technology (LIST). In September 2018, he was appointed Vice-rector for Research at the University of Luxembourg and Full Professor in Physics and Materials Science. He is one of the main architects of both the Strategy framework and the current Four-Year-Plan of the University. Jens Kreisel has extensive experience in setting-up and implementing Public-Private Partnerships, and cherishes both fundamental and applied research.



Pierre LaffontDirector, EU Affairs, France Industrie

Pierre Laffont is a graduate of the Institut d'Etudes Politiques in Toulouse and holds a master's degree in European affairs (Spain). He began his career in 2009 at the European Parliament as an assistant to MEPs, where he dealt with issues such as European industrial policy, air transport, the aerospace industry and the Structural Funds. In 2017, he joined the Brussels-based Aerospace and Defence Industries Association of Europe (ASD), where he was in charge of ASD's European public affairs.

Pierre Laffont, as Director, EU Affairs, leads France Industrie's representation to the European Institutions and coordinates France Industrie's relations with its European counterparts.
